



Education Assistance

WORF tuition assistance is available to all Chapter 3 members for IRWA, classroom numbered courses. WORF is not available for online courses.

Here's how it works...

A member registers online with IRWA HQ and then they will email a copy of their course registration to the WORF representative. Once WORF representative receives the request for assistance and proof of registration the member and HQ will receive a letter confirming WORF's assistance to pay half of the course tuition. **Members are limited to \$500 per year.**

Once you have completed the course, HQ, will send a copy of the sign in sheet to WORF along with an invoice for eligible members. WORF will then order a check and send it to HQ along with approvals for the tuition assistance.

HQ will then reissue a check to the member for the amount of assistance. Note: If the tuition was paid by an employer, it is the members responsibility to turn over the amount of assistance received by WORF.

This course presents the processes necessary to relocate a business. Participants will learn how to apply provisions of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, in conjunction with the Surface Transportation and Relocation Assistance Act of 1987, and subsequent revisions, to the relocation of non-residential entities.

Instructor: Brad K. Thomas, SR/WA, R/W-RAC, holds Bachelor's degrees in Education and Zoology from the University of Wyoming. Mr. Thomas also has a Relocation Certification from the IRWA and has been performing relocation assistance under the provisions of the Uniform Act for the past seventeen years. Brad is currently the Relocation Program Manager for HDR Engineering, a nationwide architectural, engineering and right of way consulting firm. He has been involved in right of way and real estate activities for over 30 years as a title examiner, pipeline right of way consultant, oil and gas landman and right of way agent. Prior to working at HDR, Brad was the Relocation Program Manager for the Washington State Department of Transportation, providing leadership for WSDOT staff and guidance for local public agencies. Mr. Thomas has developed relocation training courses for internal department and company use, and is currently consulting on relocation in numerous states.

This introductory level course provides novice employees dealing with real estate issues with basic right of way information and experienced employees with a broader perspective on legal issues and applicable law.

Instructor: Matthew R. Hansen, J.D., is a partner and serves as Miller Nash Graham & Dunn's team leader to its Condemnation & Real Estate Valuation team. In connection with his active law practice, Matt regularly counsels and represents both municipal agencies and private property owners in all aspects of eminent domain and general real estate litigation. Matt is an active trial attorney, having represented clients in a vast assortment of real estate litigation, including more than a dozen multi-week condemnation jury trials. Matt is a frequent speaker on legal issues involving eminent domain law and has served as author and editor for a number of state and national legal treatises. Matt has been selected a "Super Lawyer" in Eminent Domain Law by Super Lawyers Magazine for the last three years. Matt is a former President of Puget Sound Chapter 4 of the International Right of Way Association and currently serves the organization as International Vice-Chair to its Ethics Committee.

JOB INTRODUCTION

The Right-of-Way Agent, Senior vacancy is located in the Capital Projects section of the Department of Transportation and Development. This position provides right-of-way program management including developing administrative valuations and acquiring rights-of-way, easements, and fee parcels required for the construction of county roads, bridges and related projects. Additionally, this position supports the Survey and Development Review sections related to acquiring rights-of-way through land use actions. The incumbent will be expected to perform all work required to meet construction right-of-way needs on projects and to oversee consultants in order to secure land rights, relocation assistance, and appraisal. This level of work requires a high level of public contact and considerable use of independence, initiative, and discretion within pre-established guidelines. This position is filled by a single incumbent who performs all associated right-of-way work for Clackamas County.

Required Minimum Qualifications/ Transferrable Skills:*

1. Knowledge and experience using the principles of land and easement acquisition, negotiation, appraisal and appraisal of partial acquisitions, relocation assistance, the Uniform Act executive summary, and real estate law.
2. At least three (3) years of experience in easement acquisition in compliance with the Uniform Act (examples of this work would include development of 40-Day documents, development of Administrative Summary Determinations, negotiation of easements and property rights, experience in coordinating relocation assistance, experience in easement and/or fee property closings, including payment for land rights.)
3. Experience reading and understanding construction plans and legal descriptions.
4. At least three (3) years of experience reviewing property appraisals for accuracy and completeness.
5. At least one (1) year of experience coordinating relocation assistance to displaced property owners and/or tenants.
6. Experience generating and maintaining accurate legal documents and maintaining an organized file and records system.
7. Ability to effectively communicate verbally and in writing, take direction, and work well with others both independently and within a team.
8. Experience building and maintaining positive professional working relationships with fellow employees, contractors, and the public.
9. Driving is required for County business on a regular basis or to accomplish work. Incumbents must possess a valid driver's license, and possess and maintain an acceptable driving record throughout the course of employment. Learn more about the County's driving policy.

EDUCATION MATTERS



Keeping current with education and professional development is essential to all of us for advancing our careers. IRWA has a challenging task to create courses, keep them current and develop leadership training all while making these products easily available through the latest technology. This is a dynamic process requiring levels of funding the Association does not have. So how does IRWA pay for education initiatives? In part through funding support from the Right of Way International Education Foundation (RWIEF).

IRWA's five-year education plan to develop or upgrade 50 educational products is seeing impressive results. In the first two years, IRWA created seven new courses and updated/revised 30 courses. New, cutting-edge technology called VEIT (Video Enabled Integrated Technology) is further enhancing the online learning experience with the feel of being right in the classroom. For the remaining years, IRWA plans to launch six to ten new and revised products each year.

The estimated cost to produce these new and upgraded education products is \$1,400,000 over the five-year plan. IRWA asked the Foundation to potentially fund \$700,000 over the life of the plan, with specific funding requests presented annually. RWIEF committed to fund \$230,000 for the first two years. In April, IRWA will present the third year's funding request. So how does this impact the Foundation and members of IRWA?

RWIEF has current assets of approximately \$1,442,000. Of those assets, approximately \$115,000 are restricted funds held for awards. With the next three years of funding requests, a potential of \$470,000, you can see the Foundation would be deeply into reserves. That is why it is crucial to right of way education programming and to you, the end user, for contributions to the Foundation to continually grow through the coming years. Without a charity partner like RWIEF, IRWA would have to fund 100% of these costs through the general budget. It doesn't take long to see how that would impact membership fees.

Even members that do not take courses benefit from education products. How? The profits from course sales go directly to IRWA's general operating budget providing for member services, annual conferences, production of Right of Way Magazine and the IRWA website, as well as organizational support for chapters, regions and committees. So you, as a networking member, reap substantial dividends from the continual improvement of IRWA education products.

As your chapter makes plans for the coming year and it's course schedule, RWIEF wants to thank you for your support in keeping education affordable and relevant for right of way professionals. Education matters and we need your continuing support. Thank you!

The recent planning session was discussed at length:

Planning session summary: strengthen processes to **offer maximum benefit to membership**

Encourage volunteerism.
