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Time for the usual End of calendar year, Where have we been, Where are we going article. But seriously, this has been an incredible year of change, some bad, but most good. The bad: we have had some wonderful, key individuals retire from service with our chapter. The good, we took that as an opportunity to implement change as there is no better time to do so than when one is faced with the monumental task of picking up behind key people. Then we had to figure out how on earth they managed to do what they did with the few folks that volunteered over and over - we decided it was easier to reinvent the wheel, so we have and are continuing to do so.

Some of this "reinvention" was actually just stepping up to utilize the services that headquarters offered and most chapters are already using. This has included an overhaul on the education program. Previously, the monumental tasks used a great deal of time by a few people. Now, we have Headquarters register and process the students, collect the money and then send the proceeds to us. Let them do the work! We still have an Education Chair and a Course Coordinator, but the burden of the finance tracking, collection and data entry has been passed on to Headquarters, AND, we were fortunate recently to have been offered the services of a bookkeeper from Right-of-Way Associates, Inc to upload our financial transactions into QuickBooks at Headquarters! This takes some of the work from members and will simplify the year-end reporting for taxes. A huge benefit to the members will be transparency, which is one of our key goals, where each member will be able to view our books on line through their membership.

We've had assistance from Headquarters on our website and had them do a review of our bylaws to make sure we were in compliance. We are currently working on the chapter manual, AND, we've decided, as a chapter to fall into sync with the fiscal year at headquarters, which runs from summer to summer.

All in all, it has been a very busy year for a few key volunteers, but they couldn't have accomplished what they have without your support. We must be doing something right as our membership has increased, though our numbers haven't as we've lost members for various reasons, job loss, profession change, retirement, and so on. Our general meetings have experienced an increase in attendance and the speakers were outstanding! If you want to see what we've been doing and



where we've been, simply go to our website and take a peak at the newsletters! They've grown from seven pages at the beginning of the year to 16 in the November 2011 edition. These are done with style, humor and packed full of information.

We've accomplished so much this year, but now we need to look to the future, which is only limited by what we can imagine. "Member Spotlight"

Leslie Finnigan, SR/WA

Universal Field Services, Inc. Regional Manager

Chapter 3 Historian and "2011 Professional of the Year"

Anyone who knows her will tell you that Leslie Finnigan is a giving person. Set aside for a moment that she is also among the most positive and upbeat people you'll ever have the pleasure of meeting, and focus on the giving. On the professional side, IRWA members will tell of the quarter-century of contributions that led to her being named 2011 Chapter 3 Professional of the Year – an honor also bestowed on her in 1992. We'll get to the reasons for this a bit later (if we have room... it's a long list).

On the personal side, family and a wide circle of friends will tell you that her gifts range from obvious, thoughtful and helpful items, to life-setting. The two shining examples of this – literally – are daughters Michelle and Mandy. Both, in ways that are 180 degrees different, corresponding to Leslie's own octave range of life, shine at what they do. At 32, Michelle is on her way up the executive ladder at Boeing in Seattle, a path that started with her Master's degree in physics from Western Michigan (did we mention that Michelle will go anywhere, try anything if she judges it worth her time and helpful to her firm goals) and a post-grad stint at GMC. You just know, however, that there will be her own family to come. At just-turned 31, Mandy has applied Michelle's creativity in business to family. She and husband Seth Hemelstrand (on his way up the ladder at Universal, by the way) have four children who raucously reflect the security and intelligence lovingly and consistently given them. With a growing family, Mandy also (of course) works increasingly, volunteering at the kids' school, and adding hours all the time at Universal. Seth and I, as husbands and witnesses to all this, sometimes marvel to one another about what has created the traits found in Michelle and Mandy, extending to the younger quartet. We long-ago came to the same and simple conclusion – it all derives from Leslie's wrapped-in-love drive and determination. Leslie's success in life and business is all her own, itself distilled from the rules-to-live-by she learned from her grandmother, a tough but loving Texan who volunteered with the Salvation Army at 18 and moved to Washington at the end of World War II. Leslie's grandmother was the director of the local YWCA and worked at the community college until she was 83. Also, her father, John Huson, who at 86 is an embodiment of character and spirit.

What many of her fellow IRWA'ers may not know is that she personally has nurtured the Universal Field Services operation in Salem from a one-woman home-office in 1998 to a team of more than a dozen experienced pros, whose performance and diligence have taken UFS to the top rank of right of way specialists in the region. Leslie's performance in the Pacific Northwest led Universal's corporate leadership in Tulsa to ask Leslie to also take over their California office, where she has been also working for three years now.

Leslie took some time to reflect on her path to success and confesses, "Becoming a right of way professional was not what I ever planned to do. Like most people I didn't even know for sure what right of way was until I picked up the job announcement for a right of way trainee with ODOT. Originally, my plan was to teach kindergarten." She tells that, driven by her mother's drive for change and bettering her own family's lives, she was moved around a lot, eventually to Salem from Washington State when she was in high school. She wound up attending four (count 'em) different high schools. This undoubtedly led her to find that making friends and being positive was the best way to cope, qualities that have helped her immeasurably in life and work.

After attending Oregon College of Education in Monmouth, now Western Oregon University, Leslie's first job after college was with ODOT, as a file clerk and then other positions before working her way up to Right of Way Agent Trainee in the Portland Glisan Street office. She transferred to Region 2 shortly afterwards, became a senior agent a few years later and worked two and a half years at Department of Justice on condemnation cases. After that, it was back to Region 2, then two years at Washington County before starting the Universal Field Services office in 1998.

"My biggest passion is my family. My husband Bob and I have been together since 2004, and married in 2008, she says. "My daughters, Michelle and Mandy, are grown and successful women, each in their own way. Anyone who knows me has heard me discuss the kids over and over, and I can talk endlessly of the joys of being a grandmother. Chloe, age 8, Ben and Kyler, identical twins are age 6 and Grant is now 3 and I am lucky to have them live close and they often drop by the office." One of the more amazing feats that Leslie performs on a daily basis is giving to her family while never ever shorting on her work. In fact, to her the two facets of her life are blended. While the kids often stop by and the critters (two office

cats - Uffis and Irwa... those names reflect the work focus, of course) are part of that, there is Universal's noted existence as a family-oriented business. "Beyond my immediate family is my Universal family, and that is everyone from those at the corporate level and regional managers to our office group here in Oregon and Washington," she says. "I am truly blessed to have joined this group, and can't believe I have been in this position now for 13 years. Universal has supported me in so many ways over the years, both in my position as the regional manager and with IRWA." When she finds the time, and she always does, we travel. "Bob and I love to travel when we can - though many of you know, I am on the road a lot with work, but I still love to travel and see new places. Bob has taken me to London and to his homeland of Scotland. We are trying to decide where next, though our next travel commitment is with the kids and Disneyland this spring."

Leslie never loses sight of the fact that work and membership in IRWA are intertwined with all she does. In fact, one of the secrets of her ability to focus on work and family, and family and work, is that she views all from the same perspective. "I am thankful for IRWA in many ways. The organization is another extension of family for me," she explains. "After nearly 25 years in the organization, I have traveled and met so many people who have become life-long friends. I also feel this organization has played a big part in my career. My involvement at the chapter caught Universal's attention which eventually led to the starting of the Oregon & SW Washington office. It always makes me laugh when people want to know what benefit an IRWA membership can be to them - I just don't know if they have enough time to listen to all there is to say. I thank you again for giving me the honor of being the Professional of the Year. The success of the chapter means everything to me and I am excited to see what the new year brings."

Eilene Gehrke, Chapter 3 Awards Chair, described a list of what Leslie has done with and for the organization at the dinner two weeks on December 1st at the Radisson Hotel (we aren't including the list). "Leslie's involvement with Chapter 3 began in the spring of 1987 when she volunteered to assist with registration at the IRWA Annual Seminar in Portland. This was the beginning of a history of extremely active volunteer service with IRWA which continues today and shows no sign of slowing down." Eileen summarized Leslie's involvement by saying at the end of the list of activities, "In case you lost track, that's 25 years working within the right of way industry, 24 years as a member of IRWA holding 14 titled positions with a 15th occurring in 2012 and for the last 21 years has held a chair position or committee member position at the Chapter, Region or International Committee level sometimes serving positions concurrently at different levels."

Accomplishing all this, yet raise two strong daughters and focus on her own and Universal families, stems entirely from Leslie's constant ability to emphasize the positive parts and shed the negative, unless she decides to fix them. Anyone who has watched the development of Leslie's golf game will tell you. In going from duffer to doer, her game is solid where once it was spotty. (Of course, having a son in law who is a superb golfer is no handicap. Seth can really play.) But back 9 or business, her willingness is matched by her will. When Leslie decides to compete, she does what she always does, and does so, so well. She gives it all she's got. And that's a ton.



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


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SERVICE DIRECTORY
