

"Member Spotlight"

Rod Bliss, SR/WA
Chapter 3 Transportation Chair

As with most Right of Way agents, Mr. Bliss didn't start out to be one. After graduating from Oregon State University in Business Administration with his concentration in Finance, he took his worldly possessions - two army cots (one for a bed and one for couch) and boxes for end tables and coffee table - and was ready to take on the world.

You would think that he would have done a better job collecting material things, but Rod being thrifty, as his older siblings would say, paid his own way through college. As a graduation present to himself, he paid cash for a brand new Triumph (TR6) sports car, which wife Cheral sold for him for more than what he paid for the car new.

With all these goods, and enough suits and ties to make him look out of place in Central Oregon, he started his career at the Redmond branch of Western Bank in their management trainee program. Before you think this story ends badly, let me say it was one of the happiest times in Rod's life meeting new friends and his wife, who, if he didn't mention it yet sold his new sports car, after one year of marriage, in the spring of 1975. Western Bank decided the Blisses had too much mountain air and decided to move them to the big town of Brookings, Oregon.

Buckey's Utility Corner

Question: Why do Electric lines Humm?

Answer:

Typically lines aren't what is humming. Usually what is humming are the pole top transformers. These are used to step the voltage down from the higher voltage carried by the lines to a voltage that can serve your home.

The transformers have a big iron core, and the molecules in this core are changing direction 60 times each second -- which is the frequency of the electricity -- 60 Hz. So there is a constant "hum" from the iron core of the transformer. The transformer coils are usually packed in some "mineral oil" type of solution to deaden the "humming", but it usually just minimizes it -- it will still be there.

Sometimes the "Buzzing" that you hear from the power lines -- something different -- comes when there is a lot of fog or moisture in the air. The moisture in the air makes the air, more conductive (vs dry air) and this buzzing is basically the electricity arcing in the air. If you see it at night, this arcing has a bluish haze. It is called the Corona effect.

Credentialling Tidbits – Part III

The following bits of information regarding IRWA's Generalist and Specialist certification programs will help to clarify some of the requirements and to answer frequently asked questions.

This series will continue as a way of sharing answers to questions and requests received from members.

Question: "I have multiple attendance to the IRWA's Annual International Education Conference, but am I limited to just 24 hours of recertification credits towards my SR/WA Designation?"

Answer: No, you receive up to 24 hours (CEUs) of recertification credits for each Annual Conference you attend within your 5-year recertification period. Please note that out of the 72 hours required for SR/WA recertification, 16 hours must be earned by attending as a participant in, or serving as an Instructor for, any IRWA courses. Also, additional 8 hours must be earned through successful completion of one of IRWA's Ethics Courses, C103 or C104 (classroom or online). The recertification hours you received for each Conference attendance can be applied towards the remaining 48 hours.

Please refer to page 11 of the SR/WA Program Guide for details on recertification requirements.

Question: "Why do we receive only up to 16 hours (CEUs) of recertification credits for Specialist Certification for attending IRWA's Annual International Education Conference?"

Answer: Actually, you only need 14 hours for Specialist recertification. Please note that out of 30 recertification hours required for each discipline of the Specialist Certification Programs, 8 hours must be earned by attending as a participant in, or serving as an Instructor for, a course in your certification discipline and an additional 8 hours must be earned through successful completion of one of IRWA Ethics Courses, C103 or C104 (classroom or online). The 16 hours you received for your Conference attendance can be applied towards the remaining 14 hours.

For R/W-URAC that requires 72 recertification hours, attendees to the Conference receive up to 24 hours of recertification credits.



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5 Ways to Manage the Commute:

Driving to Work

2. Time Shift to Save Time: One of the best ways to time manage your commute is to avoid the rush. If everyone else is driving to work at 8AM, what if you left at 7AM?
